



Varying States of Mercury Monitoring and Reporting

With the decision to vacate CAMR being upheld, mercury monitoring and reporting has been thrown into a state of chaos. Across the nation, requirements for electric utilities vary widely, from no requirements at all to the mandatory use of continuous monitors with bias adjusted and substituted data. Further complicating the matter are consent decree and source specific requirements that must be maintained in addition to the state specific rules.
